- **I.D.E.S** — International Disaster Emergency Services is already at work to provide relief funds to Christian Churches and Missions in Haiti to help in the recovery. - **Lifeline Christian Mission** — has been actively involved in mission work in Haiti for years. The headquarters for Lifeline in Haiti is located five miles west of Port au Prince, near the epicenter of the earthquake.
